Instructions for Technical Paper Abstract Submission

Thank you for considering a submission. We are especially interested in recent developments in oil plays, multidisciplinary reservoir and enhanced recovery studies, the latest in tight-gas frac and completion strategies, new interpretations of structure and stratigraphy, new play concepts, and new insights into the petroleum systems of Rocky Mountain basins. Authors are invited to submit new and original work for either oral or poster sessions. Authors must be authorized to present all material contained within the presentation. Three half-day oral sessions are planned, including Wednesday afternoon, Thursday afternoon and Friday morning. Presentations are 20 minutes including questions and must be accompanied by PowerPoint illustration. Poster sessions are scheduled throughout the three-day meeting. Abstracts are limited to 250 words and must be submitted by email.

The submittal shall consist of an informational *Email* and a formal technical *Abstract*.

The *Abstract* shall be attached to the *Email*.

The *Email* and the *Abstract* shall be emailed to rmag.abstracts@coga.org no later than February 15, 2010. You should receive a return email confirming receipt within 25 hours, if you do not receive confirmation please resend your submission or call Brian at 303-905-5100.

Instructions for the *Email*

The *Email* shall contain the following information:

- Author's name
- Author's company or institutional affiliation
- Author' email, phone number, address
- Co-Author's name (Optional)
- Co-Author's company or institutional affiliation (Optional)
- Co-Author' email, phone number, address (Optional)
- Title of Submitted Paper
- Indicate the Session Number that Paper is Submitted to
- Indicate whether Paper is submitted as Oral, Poster, or Either (selecting Either increases chances of acceptance)
- If poster, indicate whether any of the following are requested:
 - Electrical outlet, Table, Core-Poster display, Special Security for cores or valuable display

Instructions for the *Abstract*

- The abstract shall be in Word Document or Text Format
- The Document filename shall be titled using a combination of the author's name and RMAG, for example: authorsnameRMAG.doc or authorsnameRMAG.txt
- The abstract shall consist of the title of the paper, the author(s) name and affiliation followed by the abstract.
- The abstract shall be no longer than 250 words. The abstract shall be text only and not contain any illustrations.

The organizing committee reserves the right to reject any paper for any reason without explanation or recourse to the Author.
